

Why You Need to Obtain a Building Permit

Building permits allow the Township to protect the interests of both individuals and the community as a whole, and help the Township ensure that buildings comply with:

- The Ontario Building Code
- Bonfield's Zoning By-law
- Other applicable legislation

Building Permit Application Process

Step 1: Gather Required Documents

Step 2: Submit Your Application

Step 3: Review & Approval

Step 4: Pay the Permit Fee



When Are Inspections Required?

Inspections ensure construction meets safety and legal standards. For a list of required inspections review your building permit, or contact the building department.

How to Schedule an Inspection

Contact the Bonfield Building Department at 705-776-2641 ext 129 In accordance with the Ontario Building Code, building inspections may be conducted within two business days. The period to conduct the inspection begins on the business day after the request was made, excluding weekends and statutory holidays.

Ontario Building Code Updates

As of January 1, 2025, the Ontario Building Code has undergone significant revisions, including stricter fire safety measures, updated seismic design standards, enhanced energy efficiency requirements, and clearer guidelines for accessibility, with a particular focus on improved regulations for secondary suites in residential buildings, all aimed at harmonizing with national building codes across Canada.

Township's Budget Overview

Each year, the Township sets an annual budget that includes both operational costs and capital works needed to maintain and develop the community. The budget is divided into two major components:

- Operating Budget: This includes the day-to-day costs required to run municipal services, such as staffing, building maintenance, and program delivery.
- Capital Budget: This focuses on larger, long-term investments in infrastructure and equipment, such as road repairs, facility upgrades, or new public works projects.

Importance of Municipal Budgets

Resource Allocation: The budget determines how scarce resources—money, personnel, and materials—are allocated among various municipal departments and services.

Policy Implementation: Council uses the budget as a tool to implement policy priorities. For instance, Council might want to invest more in infrastructure projects or environmental programs and will reflect those goals in the budget allocations.

Accountability & Transparency: A well-prepared and publicly available municipal budget promotes transparency and accountability. Taxpayers can see how their money is spent, which fosters trust between the Council and the community.

An important aspect of the municipal budgeting process is ensuring that it reflects the needs and priorities of the community. That's where resident input becomes invaluable. To better understand the desires and concerns of residents, the Township is actively seeking your feedback.

- What municipal services or projects should be prioritized in the upcoming budget? (e.g. by-law enforcement, recreation, emergency services)
- What infrastructure improvements should be prioritized? (e.g. roads, public buildings etc)
- How would you like to receive updates on budget decisions? (e.g. website, public meetings, newsletters)
- What are the top three areas where you think the municipality could reduce spending?

You can submit your comments to Council by emailing the Treasurer at: cao.clerk@bonfieldtownship.com or dropping it off at the municipal office.

They will be appropriately addressed and shared with Council. Your comments may appear on a Council Agenda as a public document depending on the topic and outcome you desire in your letter.

Snowmobile Safety

To drive a snowmobile, you must carry:

- a valid driver's licence, motorized snow vehicle operator's licence (MSVOL) or a snowmobile driver's licence from your home province, state or country
- proof of insurance
- snowmobile registration permit

Drivers and passengers must wear an approved snowmobile helmet.

- Conduct regular patrols and RIDE checks for alcohol enforcement with an emphasis on trails and waterways
- Inspect vessels for safety equipment compliance

PUBLIC WORKS

All about roads in Bonfield

The Public Works Department is responsible for maintaining 120 kilometres of roads in the Township of Bonfield.

Bonfield currently has 2 dedicated snowplows and a 1 ton truck with a plow attachment. In extreme weather even our grader supports Public Works to help clear the roads.

There are 4 full time and 3 part time employees trained to run the plows, and during a storm, crews start at 4:00 am and will have the entire Township plowed and sanded by 12:00 pm.

If you need to contact Public Works, please note that we have an answering service in place to ensure your call is received and addressed promptly. This applies to after hours as well.



Winter Maintenance Activities:

The Bonfield Winter Operations Policy sets out the policy and procedural framework for ensuring the safe and sustainable delivery of winter maintenance services. This policy is compliant with the Province's minimum maintenance standards.

All roadways in the Municipality are classified from 1 to 5 based on traffic volume and maintenance needs. Within Bonfield Township, most roadways fall under Class 4 or Class 5.

- Class 4 Roads: These allow up to 8 cm of snow accumulation and must be cleared within 16 hours after the snowfall ends.
- Class 5 Roads: These allow up to 10 cm of snow accumulation and must be cleared within 24 hours after the snowfall ends.

The Public Works Department is committed to timely snow removal and will deploy resources as quickly as possible to address snow accumulation and ensure safe travel.

Residents' Responsibilities

- Overnight Parking: Prohibited on all streets from November 1 to March 31 between 12:00 am and 9:00 am. This ensures the Township can completely clear streets of snow and that large emergency vehicles can get down the street.
- Snow on Roadways: Depositing snow or ice on roads is strictly prohibited under the Highway Traffic Act to prevent hazards for vehicles and pedestrians.
- Ensure Children's Safety Depositing snow or ice on roads is strictly prohibited under the Highway Traffic Act to prevent hazards for vehicles and pedestrians.
- Drive according to conditions: During and immediately after a snowstorm, reduce your driving speed to account for slippery road conditions and snow clearing operations.

Snowplow Safety

Give Plows Space:

- Keep streets clear of parked vehicles and maintain a safe distance from snowplows to allow crews to work safely and efficiently.
- Snowplows need room to operate safely. Avoid following too closely, as they often make unexpected stops or turns. Stay back at least 30 meters (about 10 car lengths) to allow plenty of space for both vehicles.
- Never attempt to pass a snowplow while it's operating.
 Reduced visibility and icy conditions make this extremely dangerous.

Be Visible:

 Snowplow drivers have limited visibility, especially during storms. Avoid lingering in their blind spots, which include the areas directly behind and alongside the plow.
